Would you like a new hobby?, and if so, have you thought of photographic modeling?

Photographers are always searching for new models and your opportunity to try modeling as a hobby is as simple as making your interest known to a keen photographer, if that photographer happens to be a member of the Crawley Camera Club you will be particularly fortunate, for the club has a studio equipped to professional standards in its headquarters at Hut 16 in The Tilgate Forest recreational centre.

F.A.Q's

Q. *What sort of modeling will I have to do?*

- A. You will not have to do any particular type of modeling, what you do will be very much what you wish. Our members are prepared to shoot Portraiture, Fashion, Glamour (including lingerie), nude and artistic nude (18+ only) but this is entirely the models choice. Dancers are particularly welcome. Many prospective models ask about fashion modeling, our club photographers are quite happy to do this, but the difficulty is that, unless you are a very keen and skilled dressmaker, the supply of garments will very soon dry up.

However, if at any time you should be asked to try any type of work that you would rather not do, and then say so, and that will be the end of the matter.

Q. *What will I get out of modeling?*

- A. There are many forms of reward, firstly you have the enjoyment actually performing in front of the camera, usually about a week after the session you should receive some prints of the many photographs that were taken during the studio session, these are considered to be your modeling fee. After you have been modeling for a time you will find that your self confidence has increased as has your deportment and make up skills.

Q. *How often would I be modeling?*

- A. That again is largely up to you, but about one session a month would be average.

Q. *What will it cost me?*

- A. Basically nothing, if you are wondering whether you will have to pay for the photographs, the answer is no it is considered that photographs taken on the day are your modeling fee. However, from time to time you may want to use make up that you would not normally wear or you may choose to buy clothes especially for modeling.

Q. *What possibility is there of becoming a professional model?*

- A. To be honest, very little. Less than one in a thousand girls who attempt to become professional models actually manage to make a living. It is far better to consider your modeling as an enjoyable hobby.

Q. *Tell me some thing about Crawley Camera Club.*

- A. Crawley Camera Club, was founded in 1961, we are a club of enthusiastic photographers with a wide range of styles and interests covering all ages and levels of expertise, both in conventional and digital photography.

The photographs of members may be produced in home darkrooms using conventional techniques, processed by photo laboratories or home produced digitally on a computer. All work is equally valued.

The club meets on Mondays and Wednesdays in Hut 16 *Tilgate Forest Recreation Centre* where nearly all our meetings take place these may comprise of competitions against other clubs, instructional talks or social meetings where members can just talk photography over a cup of tea.

Along with the main hall there is a darkroom for processing film or wet printing, a studio to professional standards, models changing room and a canteen.

On an average we try to have a studio session of once a month., however members may also use the studio or darkroom facilities at other times by making a booking.
