WELCOME TO THIS NEWSLETTER

This newsletter is being circulated to remind all members that your club's Annual General Meeting takes place in just under three weeks time. This meeting is the one time each year when club members get together to discuss and vote on any major issues concerning the running and organisation of the club. For those that are unable to regularly attend the weekly club meetings it is an ideal opportunity to hear, through the Officers' reports, what the club has been up to in the last year.

It is also the time at which the Committee responsible for the day to day running of the club for the next year is appointed. All committee posts are open to all paid-up members – perhaps you would like to serve your club on the committee? We urgently need a new Print Secretary and some help with the Slide Secretary duties.

The Annual General Meeting will be held at the club's hut on Monday 23rd June starting at 8pm

Your committee is very concerned at the low number of members who attended the pre-AGM meeting last week. In fact just two non-committee members turned up. This is the meeting at which all proposals that need to be voted on at the AGM are first registered, especially if these involve changes to the club constitution, the competition rules, subscriptions and such like. At the moment there are only three proposals (see below) to be put to this year's AGM. Anyone having any other proposals should make these known to the Chairman as soon as possible.

Proposals to date for discussion at the ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING MONDAY 23rd JUNE, 8 p.m. at the Club Hut

1. From Daniel Eugenio

That the posts of Print Secretary and Slide Secretary be merged into one post, Competition Secretary. As the existing competition secretaries no longer have to handle the booking of judges, write confirmation letters, send letters of thanks and so forth, the posts are very much less time consuming than they have been at times in the past. Most of the work is involved on, or just before, the night of the competitions, most of which involve prints and slides on the same night.

2. From John Alsop

That the nightly attendance fee be reduced over the next two years to a level sufficient to cover just the cost of providing the tea and biscuits e.g. 25-50p. The loss of income to be compensated for by an annual increase in membership fees, an annual raffle and profits from club projects.

Subject to a review of this year's accounts the proposal is to reduce the Monday night fee to £1 for the 2003/4 season and to reduce both the Monday and Wednesday nights to 50p for 2004/5 season.

Our Digital Workroom is almost operational !!

Most of you will know that we received a grant through the National Lottery towards the end of last year to purchase equipment to set up our own digital workroom. After several months assessing equipment and converting the old storeroom at the studio end the Digital workroom is almost ready to go "live".

The hardware consists of two Dell computers with digital flat screens, an Epson flat bed scanner, a Cannon film/slide scanner and an Epson A3 printer. The current DI software is Photoshop Elements but shortly we will have the full version, Photoshop 8.

SUBSIDISED STUDIO INSTRUCTION DAY

Mike is running a special studio session on Sunday July 20th for those members who have attended not more than one studio session in the last calendar year. There will be a professional model and experienced club members on hand to give advice. This is a heavily subsidised event (£7 instead of the usual £25). There are only 8 places ; first come, first served - names on the notice board please with payment to Mike as soon as possible, to secure your place.

CRAWLEY HOSPITAL EXHIBITION

Over the past eighteen months five club members have been making regular visits to Crawley Hospital to photograph “behind the scenes”. From some 700 photographs, taken 40 have been selected to form a permanent exhibition to the rear of the Main reception. The exhibition was opened by the High Sheriff of Sussex at the end of March. Admission is free. Not only was this an ideal opportunity for us to get involved in the local community but also to get lots of free publicity. Due to the generosity of Daniel and John W in particular (in not charging the club for the BW processing) the club has made a profit of several hundred pounds over the course of this project.

BELCANTO OPERA - The Magic Flute

The Belcanto Opera Company asked the club to photograph this year’s production at the Hawth. Mike, Alan and Colin set up a mini studio backstage whilst John W and John A photographed from the auditorium and the wings, during the dress rehearsals. The cast seemed well pleased with our efforts as they ordered over 300 reprints, on which the club has made a worthwhile profit of £165.
